

## ORDER REGARDING MOTIONS

Proposed amici curiae Oscar Williams, Janice Hermsen, Olena Alexander, and David Chamberlain proceeding pro se have filed a motion for leave to file an amicus brief. The unopposed motion is granted. NRAP 29. The clerk shall file the amicus brief received on January 12, 2024. The clerk shall return, unfiled, the appendix to the amicus brief received on January 12, 2024. See NRAP 30(i) (explaining that parties proceeding pro se shall not file an appendix unless ordered to do so by this court).
