

Nevada 2024 Ballot Measures and Initiatives

Vote NO! Nevada Question 1

Remove Constitutional Status of Board of Regents

A **"no"** vote removes the right of citizens to elect the University of Nevada Board of Regents and allows the state legislature to control the state universities.

Vote YES! Nevada Question 5

Sales Tax Exemption for Diapers

A **"yes"** vote supports amending the Sales and Use Tax of 1955 to provide a sales tax exemption for child and adult diapers. **NO MORE TAXES!**

Vote YES! Nevada Question 2

Revises Language for Individuals With Mental Illness, Blindness or Deafness

A **"yes"** vote supports revising the language in the state constitution to modernize the wording related to mentally ill and physically impaired or disabled persons.

Vote NO! Nevada Question 6

Abortions up to Nine Months

A **"no"** vote opposes this amendment and would stop **non-doctors** to performing abortions through all **nine months**. It also stops abortions in minors **without** parental consent or notification. Nevada already permits abortions up to 24 weeks.

Vote NO! Nevada Question 3

Top Five Ranked-Choice Voting Initiative

A **"no"** vote opposes open primaries and ranked-choice voting for general elections, which would apply to congressional, gubernatorial, state executive official, and state legislative elections.

Vote YES! Nevada Voter Identification Initiative

Requires Identification to Vote

A **"yes"** vote supports amending the constitution to require that Nevada residents present a form of photo identification to verify their identity while voting in person.

Vote YES! Nevada Question 4

Removes Slavery as Punishment for Crime From the Constitution

A **"yes"** vote supports repealing language from the Nevada Constitution that allows the use of slavery and involuntary servitude as criminal punishments.

Vote NO! Washoe County 1 (WC1)

Mandates Property Taxes Go To Libraries

A **"no"** vote opposes the creation of a dedicated funding stream to the county libraries from your property taxes, which will cause your property taxes to be increased.
